A WORD FROM AAG PRESIDENT, DAVID L. BRADLEY



Greetings All-

What I do in my studio is sacred. My art is how I express myself, and how I find understanding of what I believe is important. I can only go so far by myself, though. To go beyond my own understanding, beyond my own expression requires a leap of

faith. It takes more than one mind, one heart, to create greatness. Collaboration is a word tossed around often as a goal, but is seldom thought of as the means to achieve greatness. It is usually used to describe a partnership, or a harmony of energy, of ideas, but true collaboration means trust in each other that the work will be done with love and care for what the other has made.

When one collaborates with another, they must give up control over their creation. Think about that for a minute. Think about creating something, then giving it to someone else to make theirs, trusting that they will honor your own work as they add, alter, modify, change the work, until the identity of the maker is lost, and the result is greater than the sum of the parts.

In my life I have collaborated many times with other individuals, and with other groups of people. Through the 90's as artist in residence in 20 schools across Arizona, as part of the Arizona Commission on the Arts-Artist Roster, I collaborated with teachers to create an artist residency program that provided opportunities for every student in that school to make a ceramic tile depicting the most important thing in the world to that student. That tile became part of a permanent ceramic tile mural in that school. In those school residencies I collaborated with the students to design the mural, using drawings made by the students, usually 4th graders, to create mosaic mural panels depicting the animals, birds, insects and reptiles of the desert. In every case, the drawings and the designs were more exciting and stimulating than if I had drawn them myself. I was the guide through the process, but the children were equal partners in the creation. I empowered them and they shared their creativity with me and everyone else.

Another example is a project currently in process at Paradise Valley Community College. I am project manager for a mosaic tile mural project to Honor Indigenous People. A call for artists was made last summer for Native American artists to collaborate on the design and fabrication of a mural that honors the Akimel Authm and Pipaash people(aka Maricopa and Pima peoples) who lived here before white people, and who's descendants live here still. Dustin Lopez and Kaily Toney are native artists chosen to be artists in residence for this project. I am providing them with information on how to work with clay and ceramic tile to make a mural, while learning from them about their culture, symbolism and artistic processes. They and I, along with a core group of students, have worked together to first decide a theme for the mural, then a drawing of possible designs, then to sculpt clay, glaze tile and assemble into a permanent mural installation on campus. The completed mural will be 108' feet long, by 18" high. The theme is: The four seasons of water, because water is the source of life in the desert, for the ancient people and for us today. The mural is near completion, and I encourage everyone to visit PVCC to view this example of creative collaboration.

If you want to experience this I suggest asking a friend if they would like to collaborate on making an artwork together. This can be accomplished in many ways. You might make something and give it to them to do with as they wish. Then they give it back to you for further development/modification, etc. Or, you can both make something and exchange them for each to modify, then return to the original maker. You can repeat this process as many times as you wish. There are no rules, except one: Give your work to the other without regret. Give it wholeheartedly and even excitedly in hopes that they will take your work in a direction you never expected. That's where the magic happens. When someone takes your work to a new dimension and makes it better than you thought possible, then you will "get it."

MATERIALS LIST / ITEMS YOU MAY WANT TO BRING.

Paper: John will be demonstrating on half sheets and quarter sheets of Arches 140 lb. watercolor paper. Please bring several sheets as we will paint at least three paintings. You can use any brand you wish to use. He will bring some paper to sell just in case.

Brushes: You will need several watercolor brushes:

- 1. Either a number 10 or 12 round watercolor brush and a smaller round brush (#6)
- 2. A inch flat brush or larger- He sometimes use a 2-inch flat brush
- 3. A tooth brush
- 4. A plastic card (old credit card) for scrapping
- 5. Gloves We may use razor blades and ink for a city scape. He will have ink and razor blades on hand if you need it.

Watercolor paints: Please bring the paints you usually use. You may wish to include: Cerulean, quinacridone gold, burnt sienna, ultramarine blue, cad. yellow, sap green. and your favorite red. (cad. red).

Other items: Paper towels-a pencil -spray bottle -container for water-a board to support your paper - *Frisket /art masking liquid/
— You can use any brand you want. He uses Windsor-Newton.

Hello artists and art lovers!!

Matt's studio is small--or rather it has a lot of machinery and tools and workbenches in it, so the group size is limited to 18 People- members first. Due to his studio size, the time in the studio proper will be split into two groups for about 20 minutes each. Due to the limitation, you will need to contact me to go on the "going" list..

"We will start in the family room with a 4-minute video that shows my workflow. Then I'll take half the folks to visit the studio and leave the others to view the sculptures I have in the house, or enjoy refreshments in the backyard. After about 20 minutes, I'll switch groups. Following the studio visits we'll all get together in the family room and art room and I'll talk about the sculptures I have on hand and answer questions. To finish up, I'd like to do an unveiling of the piece I've just finished." Artist's Statement

I make narrative, realistic, people-sculptures. I see the essential humanity of folks around me—people of all races and walks and I capture it in physical forms that encourage folks to find a story that is uniquely their own. The art elicits a narrative from the viewer. I see people as engaging, amusing, beautiful, joyous, and noble characters in life's panoply. People are simply the most interesting part of the show.

I make these sculptures to remind others that life—and people in particular—are engaging, amusing, noble, beautiful, and joyous. This non-cynical perspective is very important to me in a world focused more on divisive differences than on unifying similarities. Sculpting gives me both emotional awareness and an emotional vocabulary. Foremost, I'm fascinated by, amused by, and in awe of humanity. Its diversity, uninhibitedness, energy, and overall goodness engage me.

AAG MARCH GENERAL MEETING PRESENTER

March 15, 2022 Tomi Johnston-Professor of Art History, PVCC



Tomi Johnston is full time Art History faculty at Paradise Valley Community College. She earned her Master's degree in Art History from ASU. Tomi has led a Study Abroad program to Cuba and is in preparation to lead a Study Abroad program to Florence, Italy in June 2023.

Braque between 1912 and 1914. The art critic Clement Greenberg wrote that collage had played a pivotal role in Cubism, and that Cubism played a pivotal role in modern painting and sculpture. Another critic, Peter Burger, also stresses the importance of early Cubist collages, and that they are integral to theories about avant-garde art.

Tomi will discuss the collages made by Pablo Picasso and Georges

A frequent traveler, Professor Johnston believes that art is best experienced in person. In June of 2016, she and Professor David Bradley led a study abroad program to Cuba. She is currently putting together another study abroad program to Italy, scheduled for June of 2023.

Professor Johnston is also very dedicated to making the study of Art History more affordable. She and her team of adjuncts, assisted by the PVCC OER team, converted the Art History Survey courses (ARH 101 and 102) to an OER format, saving each student hundreds of dollars. She is currently working on transferring that body of work into the MOD Pressbooks, to make it more streamlined and accessible.

Applications are being accepted on-line at ArizonaArtistsGuild.net. **Requirements**

1. The artist must be over the age of 18, and a current resident of the State of Arizona.

- 2. Submitted artwork must be original works of art in concept and design, made solely by the artist. Must have been created within the past 2 years.
- 3. All visual art media accepted.
- 4. Artwork must be submitted as digital JPEG images. Submit only one image per piece of artwork. However, up to 3 views of sculpture works maybe submitted. Videos of kinetic sculpture must be submitted in .mov format
- 5. Three-dimensional work is not to exceed 50 lbs. Artists requiring pedestals larger than 12"x12", please indicate in your entry.
- 6. Two-dimensional work must not exceed 40 inches on the longest side. Art must be adequately wired and ready to hang (no saw tooth hangers). The hanging wire must be placed no more than one quarter of the way from the top of the frame. Artwork with frames considered below minimal gallery standards will not be displayed. Mats must be neutral in color, clean and professional in presentation. Gallery wraps are

acceptable provided they are at least 1-1/2 inches deep and are painted on all four sides.

7. Artwork must be priced and available for sale, the price should include a 30% commission to the West Valley Art Museum. AAG does not receive commissions from sales. Artwork not for sale should be labeled NFS.

8. Accepted artwork must be clearly labeled with artist's name, title of artwork, medium, year of completion, dimensions, and price.

9. Complex installation pieces may require the artist to assist in installation. 10. All applicants must submit a brief bio or artist statement with their submission. 200 word maximum.

The artist retains copyright to the artwork; however, Arizona Artists Guild reserves the right to photograph and publish images of the artwork for the purposes of promotion for this exhibition and future exhibitions.
