This workshop will focus on the challenge of painting a landscape in which rocks, boulders and pebbles are significant features. There will be demos, exercises, critique and painting time. Class time will be structured, yet open enough to accommodate the artistic spirit within us all. All levels are welcome and encouraged to attend. The only prerequisite is an attitude of joy in the act of painting!

I will be demonstrating the basics of composition and then into the stages of how I paint from start to finish. Focusing on the final details and fine lines that I am known for. Trevor V. Swanson is one of the most gifted and promising wildlife artists in the world today. Coming from a long line of talented artists, Trevor is a brilliant example of inspired talent passing from one generation to another. Trevor started painting at a very young age and launched his career by age 20. By the age of 25, Trevor had won several artistic competitions, including the coveted "Artist of the Year" award from the Foundation for North American Wild Sheep. As a result of his exceptional talent, Trevor's reputation has soared to an early prominence in the world of fine art.

Trevor has traveled extensively throughout the world to capture rare and beautiful moments. He pursues a much deeper discovery on canvas. His artwork celebrates the majesty of untamed wildlife and beauty of unspoiled environments. "I paint realistically because the beauty of life is in the little things. Details such as multi-colored moss growing on the rock where a wolf is standing and the light beaming through tree branches onto the fur of a bear are the details that breathe life into the painting. I try hard to portray these subtle elements of tone and mood because they complete the story being told. "I love to lose myself in the rich color and vivid detail of my own brush strokes and discover only later where it has taken me. It gets more exciting all the time.

In this workshop you will be guided in taking artistic license in your art backgrounds. Learn unique ways to incorporate textural elements, types of textural materials, and how to adhere them to your surface. I will be instructing the purple iris and demonstrating in gouache. You may use acrylic, gouache, or acrylic gouache paints for creating. If you haven't used gouache feel free to give it a try in this class. It's an opaque watercolor that paints much like acrylic and produces brilliant effects. Subject matter will include but is not limited to composition, painting techniques, types and application of textural materials, color theory, glazing, sealing and producing a work of art with emotion and mood in the artist's interpretation. The textural additions will render your piece into three-dimensional artwork with visual interest.

Guest Presenter

Dr. Gingher Leyendecker has been teaching Life Drawing and Art Anatomy for 23 years at Mesa Community College and has been the Chair of the Art Department for six years. She has a Bachelor's degree in Painting and Drawing from New Mexico State University, a Master's degree in Painting from Arizona State University, and a Ph.D. in Education with a focus on Cognitive Development of Adults from Walden University. Levendecker believes that skill development for artists is crucial in order to realize conceptual ideas in their work. Beginning classes in life drawing focus on anatomy, structure, proportion, mass, value, line quality, composition, and movement. Once students understand these basics, they are ready to ask themselves what they want to say with the skills they have developed. This demonstration will focus on dealing with foreshortening when drawing the figure in order to create a believable and dynamic pose.

Requirements

- Participants may submit one piece of artwork
- Artwork must arrive by 5:30 pm
- Participating artists must be members of AAG.
- 2D artwork must be wired for hanging and no larger than 40 inches on the largest side.
- Sculptures must be easily handled.
- Artwork is subject to the conditions of the Hold Harmless Agreement used in all AAG exhibits. Contact the Artist of the Month Director for a copy of the Agreement.
- The Artist of the Year winner is ineligible to compete in the following year's Artist of the Month competitions.
