Student Supply List: I will be demonstrating the tulips in gouache.

8" x 10" Wood Panel (cradled) or canvas. For a dramatic effect purchase one with 1 5/8" sides.

8 oz Golden Soft Gel Medium, Matte.

8 oz Watercolor Ground

Acrylic paint brushes of varied sizes and shapes, detail for fine areas – What you presently own.

If you don't own brushes you can pick up a mixed set of Crafter's Choice at Walmart, Michael's, and

Hobby Lobby Master's Touch. These brushes are under \$10 for a package of 4+ or more with a good variety.

One 3/4" brush for applying medium and background paints.

Paper towels, water carrier, easel & board if you use one but not needed, I will provide a wet palette.

Acrylic, gouache, gouache acrylic paints to match or close to the colors in the photo. If you paint with gouache you will need to spray seal the entire piece once dry. I use Krylon matte, for a permanent seal.

Stencil Brush 3/8" or ½" Crafter's Choice by Royal & Langnickel, any craft store If you have a specialty paper in the colors of your flower you would like to incorporate into your piece you may bring it along. I will have plenty for all to choose from.

<u>Instructor will supply:</u>

Texture materials, vintage papers, specialty papers, verbiage, heat guns, brayers, stencils, Az wet palette, "rubbing" stencil paper, transfer paper.

Prep work:

- 1. Draw or copy the flower & leaves onto tracing paper only, not onto your surface.
- 2. Paint the sides of your surface with black acrylic paint.
- 3. Run a copy of the purple tulips and bring it to class.

Colors I used for the tulips:

Purple: Dioxine or Mineral is especially important due to the dark nature of the paint color.

Green: Citron or Lime, Sap

Yellow: Cad Red Medium or a mid-range yellow you have

Black White
